From the Pastor

We continue our study of the shortened form of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* called the *Compendium*. We are beginning the Third Part of the Catechism entitled *Life in Christ*. (By way of review, the First Part of the Catechism was an explanation of the articles of faith contained in the Apostles Creed, and the Second Part which we just finished was an explanation of the Seven Sacraments.) The Third Part is about Christian morality: what God requires us to do in order to cooperate with his free gift of grace received through faith and sacrament; in other words, how do we actually live *in Christ*. Here are this week's questions with the catechism's answer and my commentary.

How is the Christian moral life bound up with faith and the sacraments? What the symbol of faith professes, the sacraments communicate. Indeed, through them the faithful receive the grace of Christ and the gifts of the Holy Spirit which give them the capacity of living a new life as children of God in Christ whom they have received in faith.

Commentary: In this answer we see how the first three parts of the Catechism are related to each other. Faith is trustful obedience to God's Word, Jesus Christ, whose person and teaching are proclaimed to me by the Church. Faith leads me to participate in the divine life through baptism and the other Sacraments of the Church. The moral life is how I continually orient my will toward maintaining and deepening the divine life that infuses and elevates my human life, making me an adopted son of God, a member of Christ's body, the Church, and a temple of the Holy Spirit: truly, a "new creation" in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17).

What is the root of human dignity? The dignity of the human person is rooted in his or her creation in the image and likeness of God. Endowed with a spiritual and immortal soul, intelligence and free will, the human person is ordered to God and called in soul and in body to eternal beatitude.

Commentary: Human dignity (that is to say, its *worth*) is rooted in the fundamental goodness that God has placed in the human person at the moment of his or her creation. God has created the human race in his image and likeness for no other purpose than to share forever in the goodness of God's eternal happiness. One can sin against human dignity, either one's own or somebody else's. But no sin, no matter how grave, can take away the fundamental worth of the human person which has been placed there by God and which should always be respected.

How do we attain beatitude? We attain beatitude by virtue of the grace of Christ which makes us participants in the divine life. Christ in the Gospel points out to his followers the way that leads to eternal happiness: the beatitudes. The grace of Christ also is operative in every person who, following a correct conscience, seeks and loves the true and the good and avoids evil.

Commentary: Beatitude (happiness) describes the condition of the human person who has attained union with God. This union with God, destroyed by the sin of our first parents, is made possible again for us through the redemptive work of Christ, who, ever obedient to the Father, became man and suffered and died for us. We receive the grace of redemption by believing in Christ (faith) and being baptized in his death and resurrection (sacrament). This grace radically reorients the human person to seek and love what is true and good (that which leads to beatitude and peace) and to avoid what is evil (that which leads to the misery and hopelessness). Faith forms a correct conscience which is able to properly distinguish between good and evil. For, only real goodness and not apparent goodness leads to beatitude, i.e., to a genuine and never-ending happiness.

- The application is VERY detailed and takes a long time to complete, so please apply early!
- Catholic and non-Catholic families are eligible to apply.
- Submit ALL required documentation before December 6. Your application will be denied if you are missing any paperwork.
- Catholic families must submit an application to be eligible for Pastoral aide for the 2020 - 2021 school year.
- If you miss the deadline, no tuition assistance extensions are granted, so you are out of luck!

CONFIRMATION CORNER

We were eleven strong at Saturday's class on discipleship. The class theme and focus was that through the Sacraments of Initiation, we become members of the Church and continue the mission of the Church.

Since the renewal of our Baptismal Promises is part of the Rite of Confirmation, each candidate received a copy of the promises to be glued in their journals, and we prayed them together...and will be encouraged to continue to pray them throughout this time of preparation.

The Sacrament of Confirmation strengthens us to live our life as members of the Church - the mystical Body of Christ - and continue its mission "mak[ing] disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the holy Spirit" (Matt 28: 20).

Mr. Tom Trunk gave witness to how he lives his mission in the Church through the 40 Days of Life campaign. This pro-life movement of prayer and fasting supports the Catholic Social Teaching's foundational principle of Dignity of Human Life. After his talk, many of the candidates, several parents and a grandparent experienced this prayer time in front of the abortion clinic. Our next event is the Sponsor and Candidate Retreat on Saturday, November 9th @ 2:30pm in the School Library. We will finish with our commitment ceremony during the 5pm Mass in the Church.
