From the Pastor

We have begun the beautiful month of May, a month traditionally dedicated to our Blessed Mother. It is always a special time at St. Hugh's. On the first Sunday of the month (this weekend) we celebrate the First Communion of our 2nd graders at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. The following Sunday, Mother's Day, we honor the Mother of God with a special outdoor procession, starting from the church at the conclusion of the 11am Mass and culminating with the crowning of the image of Mary behind the rectory. Our First Communion children will process in their first communion garb with two of our newly confirmed eighth-graders who will do the crowning. All parishioners are most welcome to participate in this beautiful expression of our devotion to Mary, the Mother of Jesus and the Mother of Christ's body, the Church.

The Second Vatican Council spoke eloquently of the role of Mary in God's plan of salvation:

"The Virgin Mary, who at the message of the angel received the Word of God in her heart and in her body and gave Life to the world, is acknowledged and honored as being truly the Mother of God and of the redeemer. Redeemed, in a more exalted fashion, by reason of the merits of her Son and united to him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of the Mother of the Son of God, and therefore she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. But, being of the race of Adam, she is at the same time also united to all those who are to be saved; indeed, 'she is clearly the mother of the members of Christ...since she has by her charity joined in bringing about the birth of believers in the Church, who are members of its head.' (St. Augustine) Wherefore she is hailed as pre-eminent and as a wholly unique member of the Church, and as its type and outstanding model in faith and charity. The Catholic Church taught by the Holy Spirit, honors her with filial affection and devotion as a most beloved mother."

God chose Mary to be the mother of his only-begotten Son. She participated with God in giving the Son of God our human nature, and as a true and worthy mother she nourished him and helped him to mature as a man. As members of Christ's body, the Church, Mary is also our mother, who nourishes us in the life of faith and helps to mature as Christians. Jesus revealed this truth from the Cross when he said to Mary, "Woman, there is your son," and to the apostle John, as our representative, "There is your mother" (John 19:26-27).

The Church honors Mary in imitation of Christ himself. So intimately and completely has Christ shared his life with us that he gives us not only himself but also all that belongs to him and is close to his heart: his Mother, his foster father, St. Joseph, and all of the members of his family throughout the ages, the saints. Among all these holy people, Mary is first, surpassing all of them in dignity and beauty because her love and faith were the greatest.

Mary indeed, as the Mother of Christ, is the Mother of all Christians. As a loving mother, she not only mediates life to us, but also teaches us how to get along in life, to live it to the full. She does this by giving us her Son. She cares for us as she cared for her Son. She teaches us as she taught him. And she serves us as she served him, for, as Jesus taught, "anyone who wishes to rank first must remain the last one of all and the servant of all" (Mark 9:35).

The Church commends to the faithful the ancient practice of praying the rosary during the month of May. It is a beautiful way to honor the Blessed Mother, to implore her intercession, and to unite ourselves with her in joyful contemplation of her Son, the one Mediator between God and man.
